

Session 24 – Fairy Tales

And after two days of really suffering, but also enjoying, we decided to give up to say we surrender, Universe has made the elements too difficult. We'll postpone the course for a couple of months and do it later. At exactly the moment that I spoke with my friend Albert about that, who's helped me film this whole course, we were outside of that little chapel. That's where the car was, was when I said, I'm going to surrender and stop now, which I don't do very easily.

I said, 'Albert, this is like a half miracle.' I didn't know the exact location of that place. We were just passing it, coincidentally. I said, we have to stop and ask them again. Even though they said no. We stopped, we got out of the car. And quite an angry woman came down a very long driveway in a sort of farm place where that chapel is. And said, what do you want? And we were very kind. We said, you know, I phoned you a couple of weeks ago, if I could. hire your beautiful chapel. But you said, no. 'No, you can't, because we've lost somebody recently and we are in the middle of mourning.'

We felt so compassionate for this woman and we said, we're so sorry. Who did you lose? And it was their next-door neighbor. And we heard all about the story and we got a loving, open heart relationship. Then Albert explained very kindly to her the challenges we were having with filming the course. And she said, well, come in then and have a look in that voice. We went in



and in the end, she welcomed us and let us hire the chapel, so we managed to finish some of the course there.

Then we needed another location to do the rest of the films. And I was looking all over Holland to try and find something that would inspire me and make me happy and make Albert happy and hopefully make you happy. And Albert looked at me and he had tears in his eyes. And I thought, well, what's happened now? He opened his diary. He'd never heard of *Kasteel de Haar* in his life. Someone that he'd been trying to make a meeting with for six months is in the committee here that helps keep this beautiful castle alive. And he'd made an appointment here in the very same week that we were filming here together.

My friends, these things just keep happening. These coincidences are just for me, not coincidences at all anymore. It's like having little bread crumbs all the time in front of you. And when you're living in the now, they just keep being given to you and you sort of follow them. What I'm saying is that the opportunities keep arising exponentially when you surrender to the moment. And I call that synchronicity the synchronicity of universe.

I hope with all of the practice that you're doing that you will allow yourself to surrender to these things and stop grasping at things, and again, I've told you this many times, in the way that I did for so many years. Be satisfied with whatever opportunities come on your path and also with any challenges that come on your path, because the path is so unbelievably beautiful, valuable, and something that we can cherish every single moment of the day.
